Dear Mr. Kramer:

We have now completed our review of your complaint against Dr. Bill J. Fyfe. Our Rules and Procedures allow a complaint to be opened only if certain conditions are met. (See Part V, Sections 5.4 and 5.5.) On the basis of a review of all the information related to this matter, we have determined that an ethics case cannot be opened. Consequently, the complaint you have filed against Dr. Fyfe has been closed.

Although we ordinarily do not disclose the basis for dismissals, we can provide some information regarding the most frequent procedural reasons for dismissals. Without making any representation that one or more applies to your complaint, complaints may be closed because:

1. The alleged behaviors are not prohibited by the Ethics Code, even though the complainant believes that they are or should be.
2. The serious concerns of the complainant do not meet cause for action, and a minor point does. Any violation found, on that basis, would not warrant action.
3. The allegations are conclusions that are not supported by behaviors.
4. There is a reasonable basis to believe the alleged behavior cannot be proved by a preponderance of the evidence.
5. The alleged violations have already been adequately addressed in another forum or are likely to be corrected.

Let us assure you that we took your complaint seriously and made the decision that seemed most fair in light of our procedures and all the materials received.
