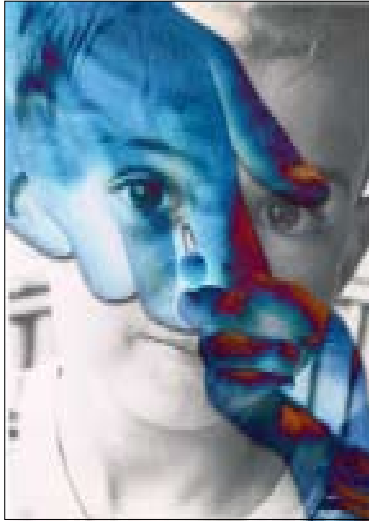

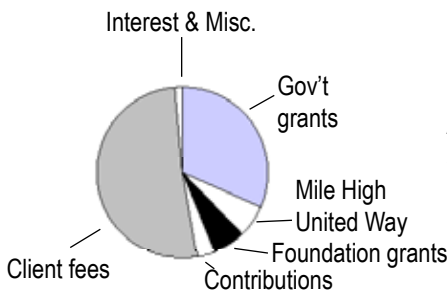

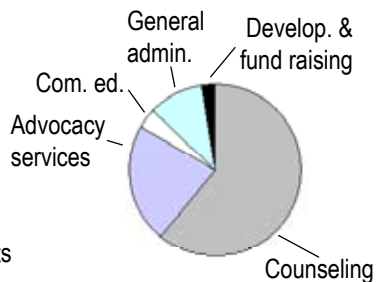

AMEND's Programs & Services

Counseling

Our counseling sessions focus on taking responsibility for the abuse and building anger management, conflict resolution, and communication skills. Specialized counseling is offered for offenders with addictions, gay offenders, parents, those seeking anger management, and those seeking domestic violence counseling in a Christian context. AMEND is also an ADAD licensed agency approved to provide DUI Level II Education and Therapy classes.

Victim Advocacy

AMEND's victim advocates provide safety planning, referrals, and 24-hour crisis assistance to the victims at no cost. We also offer weekly educational support groups, including a group for gay male victims of domestic violence. AMEND also offers counseling for children who have witnessed abuse (a collaboration with SafeHouse Denver).

In 2006, AMEND collaborated with Family Tree to create and offer a How to Help workshop designed for friends and family members of domestic violence victims. For more information, contact (303) 832-6363 or (303) 420-0412.

Community Education

We provide trainings around the state of Colorado for children, youth, and adults to help the full community better understand and recognize domestic violence and how to help prevent it. Topics include the dynamics of domestic violence, domestic violence in the workplace, dating violence, characteristics of offenders, victim advocacy within a treatment agency, and more. In 2006, AMEND reached 9,217 individuals through community education. To request a speaker, call (303) 832-6363.

AMEND provided advocacy and support services to 910 victims and their 541 children in 2006.

From the Executive Director

Sadly, the community need that led to the founding of AMEND has not ceased. In 2006, Colorado lost 41 community members to domestic violence. The five-county metro area had over 6,000 domestic violence cases filed.

Wherein lies the hope? Hope comes with offering help. AMEND's counseling for men, advocacy and safety planning for victims, and support services for children all move in one direction: helping to create safe and peaceful homes for our community's families. Each service is designed to make a positive difference in a person's life.

AMEND begins this process with dedicated, quality staff. The therapists and advocates who work at AMEND bring a wealth of experience in working with domestic violence, addictions, parenting, communications, compulsive gambling, depression, and special populations (e.g., gay offenders and victims and Christian offenders). Their skills, empathy, and compassion keep the organization going.

Our services also benefit from collaborating with others. In 2006, we collaborated with Family Tree, SafeHouse Denver, the Women's Crisis & Family Outreach Center, Arapahoe/Douglas Mental Health, the Colorado Anti-Violence Program, the Denver Domestic Violence Coordinating Council, Colorado Coalition Against Domestic Violence, the Department of Human Services, Project Safeguard, the Denver City and District Attorney's Offices, and the Denver Police Department to better contain offenders and more effectively serve victims, youth, and family members affected by domestic violence.

On behalf of AMEND and the clients and victims we serve, I want to thank each of you for all you have done to support AMEND's programs. I hope you know that by helping AMEND you have made a difference in someone else's life.
