Dear Colorado Supreme Court - Office of Attorney Regulation:

I am writing your office to file a complaint against John S. Gleason of the Office of Attorney Regulation (OAR).

On January 3, 2003, I filed a complaint against Judge Raymond Satter with the OAR via USPS mail. Per the OAR web site (<http://www.coloradosupremecourt.com/Regulation/Complaints.htm>), the OAR is responsible for complaints against "*Colorado Licensed Attorneys Serving as Municipal Court Judges.*" Moreover, the Colorado Bar web site states that Judge Satter is an attorney licensed in Colorado. In addition, the OAR web page states that someone from the OAR office would make contact with the person filing the complaint in a "few days". As of today, I have not heard one word from the OAR about the complaint.

Per their web site the OAR office is not funded by tax dollars, the OAR is funded by fees charged to attorneys. If an attorney has to pay a fee, I am sure this fee is passed along to the consumer through higher rates. Call the OAR's funding what you want but in the end the individual consumer has to pay to run the OAR office which is obviously more concerned about protecting their "members" than the consumer.

If Mr. Gleason doesn't have the leadership skills to run the OAR office, I suggest you replace him with someone who has the leadership skills to process complaints in a timely fashion.
