Dear Dr. Martinez:

Please allow this letter to serve as my personal thanks and gratitude for the very valuable time that you spent in speaking with me several weeks ago. I also wanted to write because I am in need of clarification of the letter that you sent to me date September 12th, 2004.

Back on the 29th of April at about 11:30 (MST), I called and spoke with Marge Bennet regarding new evidence that was made available to me concerning Tom Olbrich and my desire to seek reconsideration on the matter. Marge conferred with her supervisor, Joanne Krause, who advised me to file an, "Application for reconsideration." Subsequent to that, I spoke with you and you confirmed this policy concerning applications for reconsideration.

In August, I sent in a voluminous complaint replete with exhibits concerning Olbrich. Some time thereafter, I spoke with Linda Caudillo, who informed me that the Complaint had been referred to the "State Grievance Board," rather than the psychologists or social worker board (I am unclear if there is a difference).

More time passed, but I never received any letter indicating a disposition. In November, I followed up with you and you confirmed that the Board did, indeed, meet, but declined to conduct an inquiry. Specifically, you said that the *prima facie* statements in my Complaint, if true, would have been enough to warrant an inquiry, but that the Board either didn't believe all of my assertions to be true, or was unable to find enough support for them in the documentary evidence that I provided. You also offered to send out the [missing] letter of a "final agency decision," necessary for appeal. I did then receive a letter from you, but it was dated September 12th, 2004 (though it referred to a meeting that occurred on October 25th 2004). The letter did not indicate that I had applied for reconsideration of the Olbrich matter (merely that the matter had already been dismissed in 2001). Thus, I wonder if I could bother once again (and I do apologize for being burdensome!) to reproduce that letter with the proper accurate date, some notation indicating that this is, indeed, a final agency decision and that it is in response to my application for reconsideration on the Olbrich matter. I also want to respectfully request that you include any findings that were made available to you and that you can recall, such as what you explained to me on the phone relative to the *prima facie* sufficiency of my allegations, and the insufficiency of the supporting documentation as well as the fact that the reason the claims were dismissed against Ryan, Wilson, JCMH and CMHIFL is because your office has jurisdiction over Olbrich, only. With this information, I believe that I may be able to properly pursue an appeal.
