As a follow-up to my letter I wrote you last week, please find attached one motion I prepared for the Court and one response to an emergency motion. The emergency motion involves the Court taking *ex-parte* information from the opposing counsel, and reversing its own order to allow me due process of fifteen days to review the preparation of the final orders by the opposing counsel and compare it to the actual transcripts that I had ordered. In this case, the opposing counsel had lied to the Court in her emergency motion, stating that I was simply refusing to sign the final orders, outright. The Court believed her without questioning me. Her preparation of the orders contains all kinds of mistakes, which are in her client's favor or in her own favor. Additionally, in my own emergency motion for a forthwith hearing on the matter, I have cited a number of other examples of abuse of judicial discretion in favor of the opposing counsel and/or her client.
