This matter is before the court on Appellant's Combined Motion for Limited Remand and For Leave to File Oversized Brief and/or Bifurcation of the Issues on Appeal (the "Motion"). The Motion requests three types of relief: (1) limited remand to district court, (2) permission to file an oversized opening brief, and (3) bifurcation of appellate issues. The first and third requests are addressed below. The second request is addressed by separate order.

Appellant's request for a limited remand of this appeal to the district court is referred to the panel of judges that will decide this case on the merits.

Appellant's request for bifurcation of the issues raised in this appeal is denied. Even if separate notices of appeal had been filed on different orders issued by the district court and separate appellate cases had been opened as a result, all related appeals arising

from the district court case would have been consolidated into a single appeal. It is this court's policy to have related issues decided by the same panel of judges simultaneously where possible. Thus, all briefing in this appeal would have been consolidated eventually, regardless of how the issues were initially presented.
